Algeria Women and Cameroon men grab gold medals

Maputo, Mozambique, September 7, 2011- Cameroon Men's team and Algeria women grabbed the gold medals of the 2011 All Africa Games following their reciprocal victories in the final matches held at Maxaquene hall in Maputo, Mozambique on Wednesday.

Cameroon team had to fight for more than two hours to overpower Algeria in a stunning encounter 3-2 (23-25, 25-22, 25-17, 21-25, 15-11) to pick their third gold medal at the All Africa Games. The reverse happened in the women category where Algeria crushed Cameroon 3-1 (25-14, 25-23, 18-25, 25-14) in an exciting final to win their third and second in row gold medal in the games.

Kenya won the bronze medal of both competitions after they downed Nigeria in the women competition and Rwanda in the men.

The final day was attended by CAVB President Dr Amr Elwani, Mozambique Minister of Sports Pedrito Caetano, ANOCA president General Lassana Palenfo, COJA Director Tose Cossa, Vice director of the Games organizing committee (COJA) Cesar Penalva, CAVB Vice President Majore Timba, and the other CAVB officials Mory Keita, Aminata Fofana, Morkinyo Ebenzer, Majid Djirad, Emmanuel Ngoloko and Howyda Mondy.

Men Gold Medal Match

Cameroon beat Algeria 3-2 (23-25, 25-22, 25-17, 21-25, 15-11)

Cameroon fought for two hours to serve up a superb contest and win the gold medal of All Africa Games after they cruised past spirited Algeria in a thrilling five setter 3-2 (23-25, 25-22, 25-17, 21-25, 15-11). Cameroon big gun Jean Ndaki guided his team with his unstoppable hits and sharp services and was the match star specially in the tiebreak where he scored the most critical points.

The first set went point by point all through and started by Algerian dominance by the quick attacks through the center Amine Oumessad, but quickly Cameroon came on through the hits of Jean Ndaki from position 2 and Nathan Wounwmbaina so they draw 8-8 and then 16-16. Algeria again went ahead with the combinations of the setter Khaled Kessai who served well to the opposite attacker Mehdi Hachemi and Oumessad. Cameroon fell into several service and reception mistakes that allowed Algeria to win the set 25-23.

The second set showed early Algerian advance with their motivations as Ali Kerboua and Billel Soualem did well beside the tight block, so they came ahead 4-1 before Cameroon came near again at the first TTO 8-7 for Algeria. The set went point by point till Algeria made the first big lead 19-16. Cameroon players retained their consistency and succeeded to have a big jump through Ndaki's powerful services to win the set 25-22.

Cameroon team was highly spirited in the third set as Ndaki led them to a marvelous performance through his spike services and razor sharp hits from position 2. Algeria's reception became unstable as they lost 5 points from service aces and it was easy for Cameroon to go ahead widely 25-17 to lead 2-1.

Again Algeria adjusted the reception and backline defense in the fourth set to lead 8-7 at the TTO after a group of quick attacks from Oumessad and Youcef Zerouki. Cameroon also started to use the middle blocker Zamguim Nongny and Marie Engala and they succeeded to draw several times till Algeria had a comfortable lead 16-13 at the second TTO. The Algerian team went through thereafter to win the set 25-21 to draw 2-2 and extend the match to tiebreak.

Ndaki did the key role in the tiebreak with his spike service and sharp spikes form position 2 that couldn't be stopped by the Algerian team who led 8-5 at the court turn. Algeria tried to come back, but with several reception and spiking mistakes Cameroon continued their spirited performance to win the tiebreak 15-11 and the difficult match 3-2

Men Bronze Medal Match

Kenya beat Rwanda 3-0 (25-15, 28-26, 25-17)

Kenya grabbed the bronze medal following their win against their neighbors Rwanda in straight sets (25-15, 28-26, 25-17) in the third position match lasting 74 minutes. Kenya revenged to their loss against Rwanda in the All Africa Games Qualifications held in Kigali, Rwanda early this year.

Kenya started the match using their sharp spike services specially from Ontere Nyang and Philip Maiyo that affected the Rwandan attacks, so Kenya went through to win the first set 25-15. In the second set Rwanda arranged their combinations through the setter Herve Kagimbura who served his passes to the opposite attacker Guma Yakan in position 2 and the wing spiker Eric Nsabimana in position 4. Rwanda led

many times till they have two set points, but Kenya succeeded to save the set and win hardly 28-26. The Rwandan players became less motivated in the third set while the spirited Kenyans continued their steady performance to win the third set 25-17 and the match 3-0 to advance one step after they finished fourth in the last edition in Algeria 2007.

Men 5th Place match

Nigeria beat Seychelles 3-0 (25-22, 25-23, 25-19)

Nigeria used their skilful attackers and the sharp spike service to clinch a straight sets victory (25-22, 25-23, 25-19) over the struggling Seychelles in the fifth place match lasting 63 minutes.

Nigeria's spike service was effective in the crucial moments of the match and that allowed them to win the first and second sets narrowly, but the third set showed more Nigerian dominance after Seychelles players fell into several reception mistakes.

Nigeria is ranked fifth and Seychelles finished sixth.

Men 7th place Match

South Africa beat Mozambique 3-0 (25-14, 25-12, 25-19)

South Africa hammered the hosts Mozambique 3-0 (25-14, 25-12, 25-19) in the seventh position match lasting 57 minutes. The South African team overwhelmed the match through their taller players as their middle blockers prevented Mozambique to perform their attacking strategy.

South Africa finished at the seventh place while the hosts are ranked eighth.

Women Gold Medal

Algeria beat Cameroon 3-1 (25-14, 25-23, 18-25, 25-14)

Algeria Women team kept the gold medal of the All Africa Games home after they beat battling Cameroon team 3-0 (25-14, 25-23, 18-25, 25-14) in the final match lasting 109 minutes. Algeria were the defending champions as they had the gold medal of All Africa Games in their homelands 4 years ago.

Algeria stated the match more disciplined in defense while Cameroon team was suffering the lack of concentration after the great Marathon they played against Kenya yesterday. The Algerian setter Fatima Zahra used her combinations to deceive the Cameroonian blockers as she set to the opposite Zohra Bensalem and the middle blocker Lydia Olumou to lead widely 8-3 at the first TTO. With Cameroon poor reception Algeria went through to win the set easily 25-14.

The second set was different as Cameroon adjusted their block through Boum Ngo and Roline Tatchou to lead 4-0 and 8-2 at the first TTO. Algeria again regained their pace and succeeded to arrange the block of Olumou and Mouni Abdrrahim to decrease the point deficit gradually till they draw for the first time 20-20 and through a service from Faiza Tsabet they led for the first time 21-20. With the experience of Tsabet and Zahra Algeria succeeded to win the critical points at the end of the set to win narrowly 25-23.

The Cameroonian performance raised to the top in the third set as they arranged their combinations through the setter Tatiana Baran and the attackers Rose Rebecca and Roline to come back after the first TTO. The Algerian reception showed temporary disturbance that allowed Cameroon to continue leading till they won the set 25-18.

With the marvelous performance of the left attacker Faiza Tsabet Algeria went easily through to win the fourth set 25-14 after she sent her razor sharp hits from all the net positions allowing her team to win 3-1 and the gold medals.

Women Bronze Medal Match

Kenya beat Nigeria 3-0 (25-14, 25-15, 25-18)

Kenya rebounded from a semifinal loss to Cameroon with a straight-sets (25-14, 25-15, 25-18) win over Nigeria in the bronze medal match in 61 minutes. The Kenyans get rid of all the drawbacks that led to their defeat in the semifinal as their reception was the main factor of their victory.

The Kenyan coach changed the main line up and started with Janet Wanja as a setter and succeeded to control the net action through the experienced center Brakcides Khadambi to win the first set 25-14.

The outside hitters Everline Makuto and Mercy Moim were also successful in their hits from position 4 to penetrate the Nigerian bloc frequently till they won the second and third sets widely.

Women 5th place Match**Senegal beat Botswana 3-0 (25-15, 27-25, 25-14)**

With their tight block and good reception, Senegal overpowered Botswana 3-0 (25-15, 27-25, 25-14) in the fifth place match lasting 61 minutes. Senegal finished the competition at the 5th position while Botswana ended 6th.

Senegal was the better team throughout the match with their better discipline and arranged block except sometimes in the second set when Botswana improved their attacks to come near and they were able to win the set but Senegal won the crucial points after Botswana lost two set points.

Women 7th place Match**Seychelles beat Mozambique 3-0 (25-19, 25-7, 25-21)**

Seychelles achieved the competition first victory as they revenged Mozambique 3-0 (25-19, 25-7, 25-21) in the seventh place match. Mozambique won the first match at the group stage 3-2.

Seychelles finished at the seventh position while the host Mozambique ended at the bottom of the table.
